CONTINUING STUDENTS COURSE REGISTRATION PROCEDURES SUMMER 2008

This summer, we are testing a new registration procedure. Instead of course sections being assigned on a first-come, first-serve basis, course registrations will be processed in random order, just like the Clinic registrations. One huge advantage of this model is that there is no assigned time for you to submit your form, so you may drop your completed registration form off at the Front Desk whenever you would normally come to campus on Monday or Tuesday. If it is more convenient for you, feel free to send your form with a friend, or fax it to us.

Class lottery will commence at 7:30AM on Wednesday, March 12. In order to be included in the priority process, please submit your form by that time.

- Make sure you are in good standing with the Finance Office.** Registrations cannot be processed for students who have Financial holds.
- Complete a Course Registration Form for Summer 2008.** Most descriptions and co/pre-requisites are in the Student Handbook, which is available at <http://www.nesa.edu/sa/index.html>; descriptions for new and updated electives are included here.
 - **print your name legibly on the front**
 - **check a box for your track, and estimate when you will graduate**
 - **select your preferred sections**
 - **select your single priority section**
 - **electives and sciences are listed on the back**
 - **sign the back**
- Leave the form in the box at the Front Desk.**

A copy of your course registration will be placed in your box within a week after the completed form is received, which will show the courses and clinics you have signed up for, and the cost for the term.

Note the opportunity to make one course your top priority. We will do everything we can to see that as many folks get their first choice as possible, but sometimes it just isn't possible. All students are scheduled for their priority course first, THEN we go back to the top of the pile and put in all the rest of the courses.

If you would like to make changes to your registration after you have submitted the form, please complete and submit an Add/Drop Form. Remember to have your advisor sign if you are dropping a Core course!

Elective Updates:

JAS: Clinical Application of Adjunctive Techniques (2 cr.)

Prerequisites: JAS: Local Tx

This class will enhance local treatment strategies for difficult/challenging clinical pathologies. The class will have both didactic and practical components. A comprehensive lecture will be followed by demonstration, and then students will practice, treating each other.

Topics will include Adrenal Exhaustion, Thyroid Disorder, Oketsu, Carpal Tunnel, and musculoskeletal pain/problems. Modalities explored will include use of the Hibiki-7 (outside of Divergent Channel treatment), Magnets, Manaka Hammer and Needle (dashin), Pachi-Pachi and Low Level Laser. Students are required to purchase 800 gauss magnets and Manaka Hammer and Needle; notes will be provided.

Advanced Chinese Needle Techniques (2 cr.)

Bing Yang

Prerequisites: **Actions & Effects II (UPDATED!)**

This course explores advanced Chinese needle techniques, with didactic presentations as well as needling practice. The focus is on development of both basic needle techniques such as tonification and dispersion, and on more complex techniques such as deep insertions and the use of longer needles. Also covered are acupuncture techniques, point combinations and ancient acupuncture cases from the classic "Great Compendium of Acupuncture and Moxibustion". Students will also learn how to obtain deqi more quickly through Qi Gong practice.

Auditing classes: Requests to audit elective classes will not be accepted until the first week of classes.

Research II: Students who are interested in registering for Research II or III should meet with Lisa Conboy [mailto:lisa_conboy@hms.harvard.edu] and submit an add/drop form with her signature before the second week of class.

Assisting: students who are enrolling in Clinical Skills will be automatically registered for 30 hours of assisting. Anyone else who needs to register for assisting hours should just write them in on the bottom of the form.
