



## ***Shoshin- Non-insertive Pediatric Acupuncture***

This seminar teaches students how to perform acupuncture on children using non-insertive techniques such as pointing, rubbing, tapping, and scratching. Students will learn Japanese meridian theory for children focusing on the pulse diagnosis approaches developed by experienced Japanese students.

**T.Koei Kuwahara, LicAc** graduated from the Tokyo Therapeutic Institute in 1979 and went on to complete an intensive five-year live-in apprenticeship with Fukushima Kodo, renowned master and developer of the Toyo Hari systems of acupuncture. Having researched and taught for the Toyo Hari Association for 15 years, Mr. Kuwahara has continued to develop and now teaches traditional Japanese (Hari) style of acupuncture that draws from the various systems practiced by his teachers: practitioners such as Kunsei Kudo (bloodletting), Tetsuo Shiomi (meridian therapy), Masanori Tanioka (pediatrics), and Masato Nakagawa (Ki therapy). He has practiced Aikido for 35 years and has conceived of using the Ki developed there in his healing work. Mr. Kuwahara maintains a private practice in Watertown, MA.
