There are as many ways to study Chinese source material as there are types of source material. This course explores two useful ways to approach and learn from the valuable experience of our predecessors. On day one we will look at a variety of methods used by one doctor, namely Dr. Huang Huang, a well known *Nan Jing* classic formula doctor. Dr. Huang is known for his innovative and profoundly effective approaches to the use of *Shang Han Lun* and *Jin Gui Yao Lue* formulas. We will look at his approach to working with a variety of issues including cancer and psychological disorders. On day two we will look at one topic at a time to see how it is approached by several different doctors. In this way we can observe the similarities and differences between the practitioners and then see how we might apply their insights in our own practices. The first topic we will explore is *Glomus*. The second topic will be *Shao Yang* pattern illnesses. Sharon has found that understanding middle warmer and *Shao Yang* blockage can unlock many complex and difficult types of cases. This program focuses on Chinese Herbal Medicine.

The objective of this course is to give students clinically valuable tools from some of the masters of our medicine. In addition this class will teach students two methods for studying the work of experienced practitioners. Handouts will give students a body of reference material for future use.

Sharon Weizenbaum graduated from the New England School of Acupuncture in 1983 and has been practicing Chinese medicine for over 25 years. She continued her language study at Mt. Holyoke College and translates much of her own teaching materials. In 2007 she traveled back to China to study classic formulas with Dr. Huang Huang, who continues to be one of her teachers. Sharon is the director of White Pine Healing Arts clinic and educational facility. She teaches the Graduate Mentorship Program and Integrative Mandala Acupuncture nationally as well as shorter courses.
